Jesus said, *“be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life”* (Revelation 2:10b). **John Hus** (pronounced Yan Hus in Czech) was a martyr for the Lord Jesus Christ, and he shall be given just such a crown by King Jesus Himself. This late medieval university professor kept a good testimony for his Lord in the midst of official persecution, betrayal, and eventual execution. I watched this movie around 1995, and although it’s been fifteen years I still can remember how powerfully it moved me. I strongly recommend you watch it too.
