10 YEAR ENROLLMENT HISTORY

The number of students enrolled at Nyack College decreased during the mid 1980's. From 1985, in which Nyack experienced its lowest enrollment, until now there has been a gradual increase. The number of traditional students then seemed to stabilize at slightly over 500 students. However, the Fall 1992 Nyack Campus enrollment was the highest in over a decade. Additionally, the enrollment in the Adult Program has increased from 33 students in 1989 to around 200 students.

FTE has followed a trend similar to that of Headcount. There has been an increase of 278.5 units since 1985 (Fall 1985 FTE = 508.8, Fall 1993 FTE = 787.3). This represents a 55% increase.

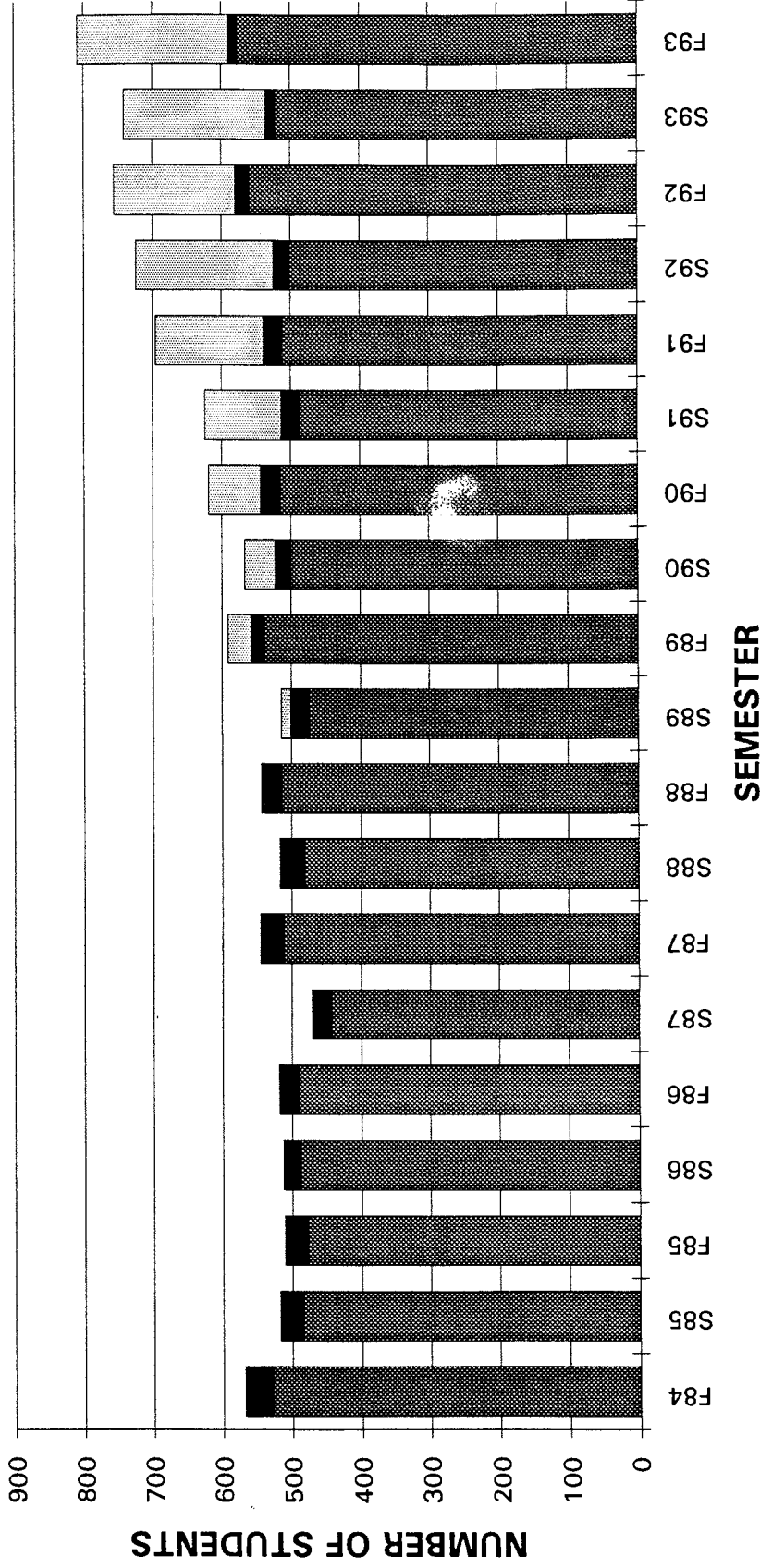

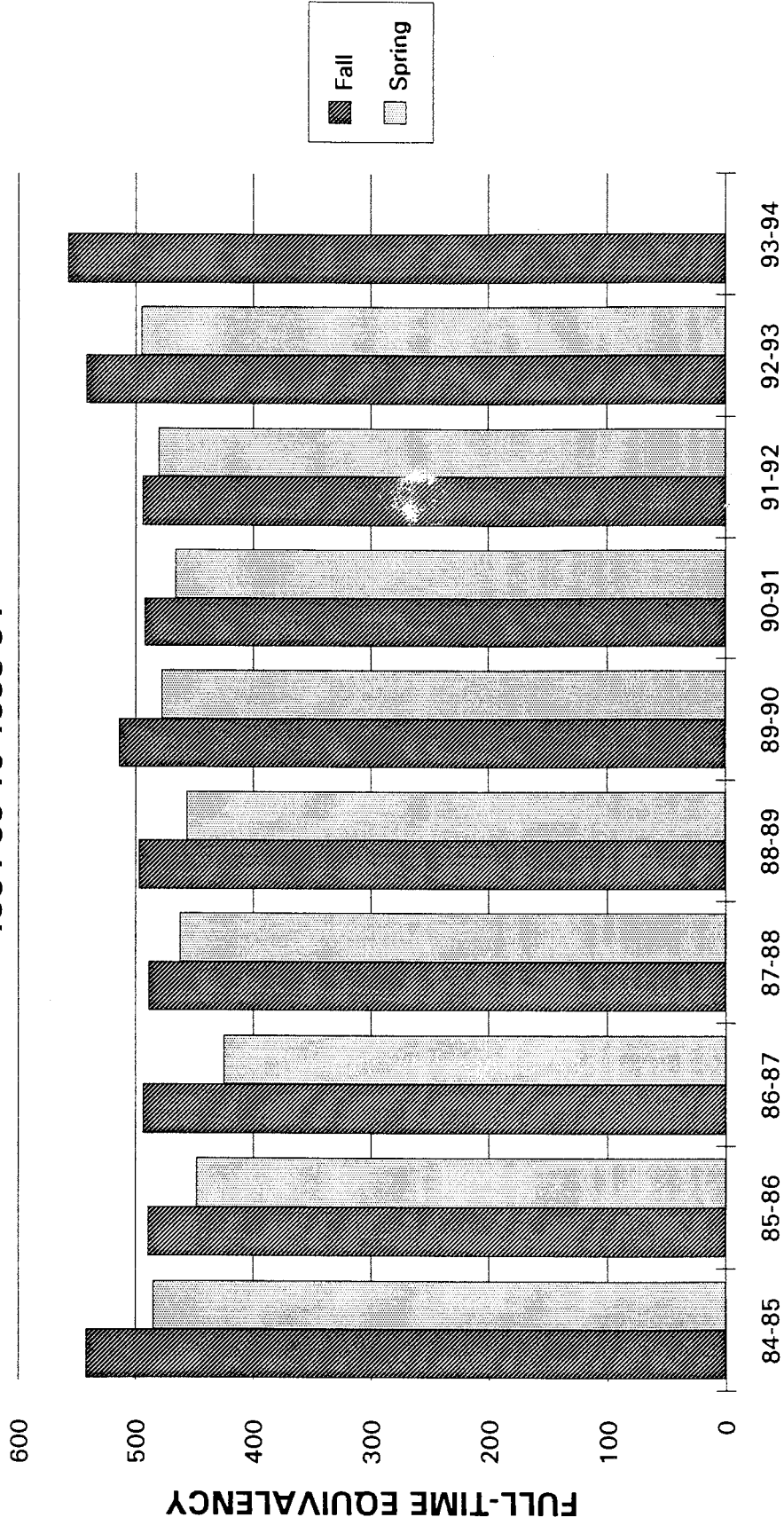
HEAD COUNT ENROLLMENT

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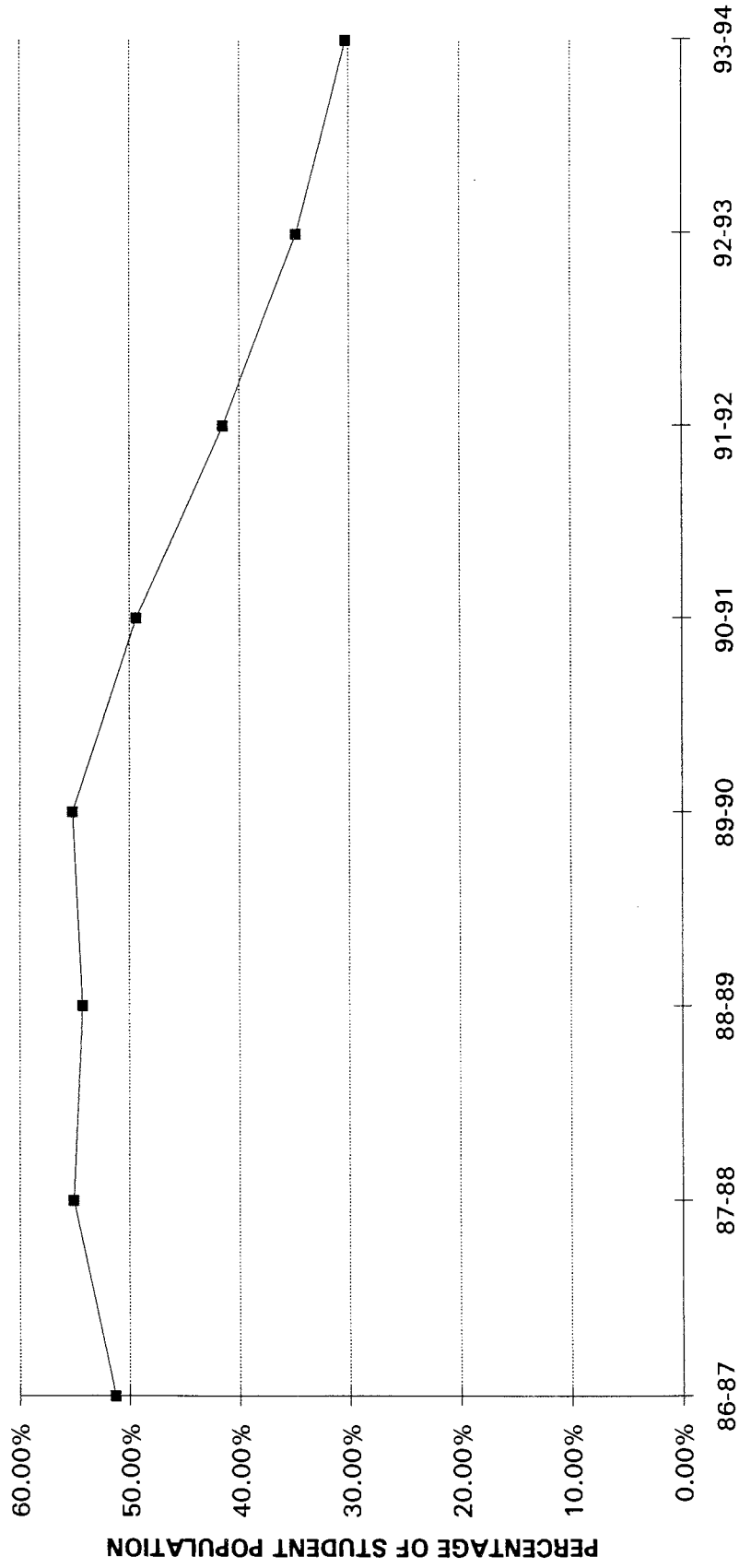

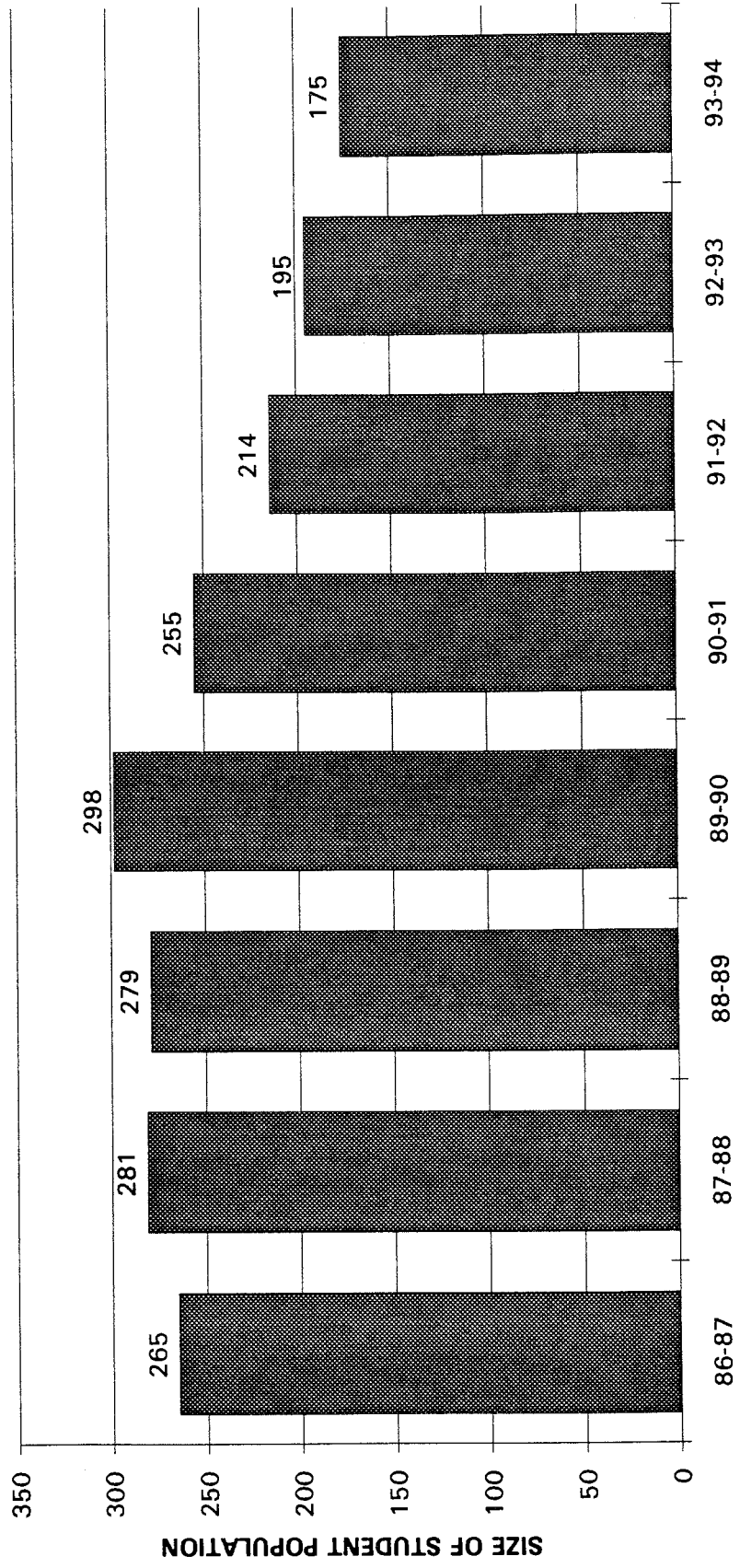

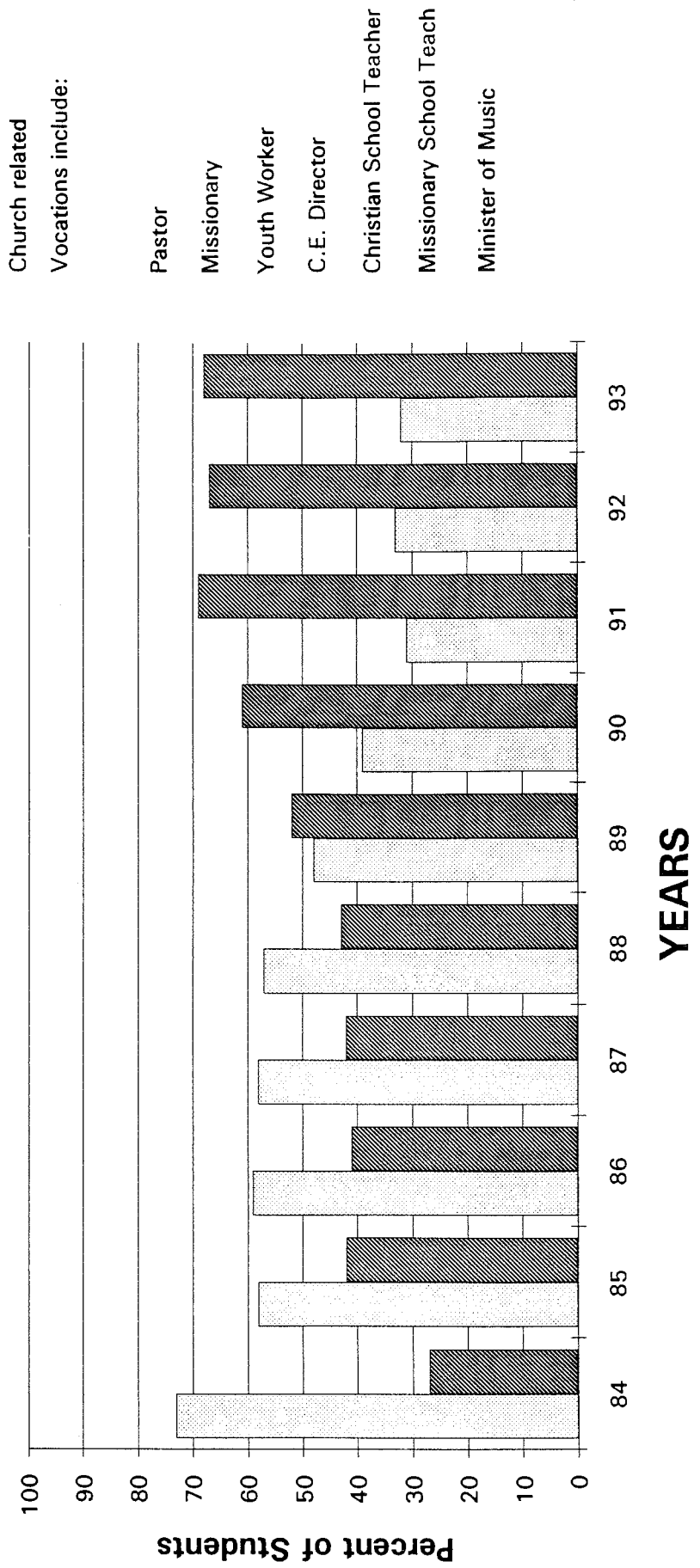
