#### 10 YEAR ENROLLMENT HISTORY

The number of students enrolled at Nyack College decreased during the mid 1980's. From 1985, in which Nyack experienced its lowest enrollment, until now there has been a gradual increase. The number of traditional students then seemed to stabilize at slightly over 500 students. However, the Fall 1992 Nyack Campus enrollment was the highest in over a decade. Additionally, the enrollment in the Adult Program has increased from 33 students in 1989 to around 200 students.

FTE has followed a trend similar to that of Headcount. There has been an increase of 278.5 units since 1985 (Fall 1985 FTE = 508.8, Fall 1993 FTE = 787.3). This represents a 55% increase.

# RETENTION RATES FOR FALL ENROLLMENT OF FRESHMEN & TRANSFERS

Generally retention rates are considerably higher for first time freshmen students than for transfer students for their second year at Nyack. The overall retention rate for the 1992 cohort was 70.5%.


