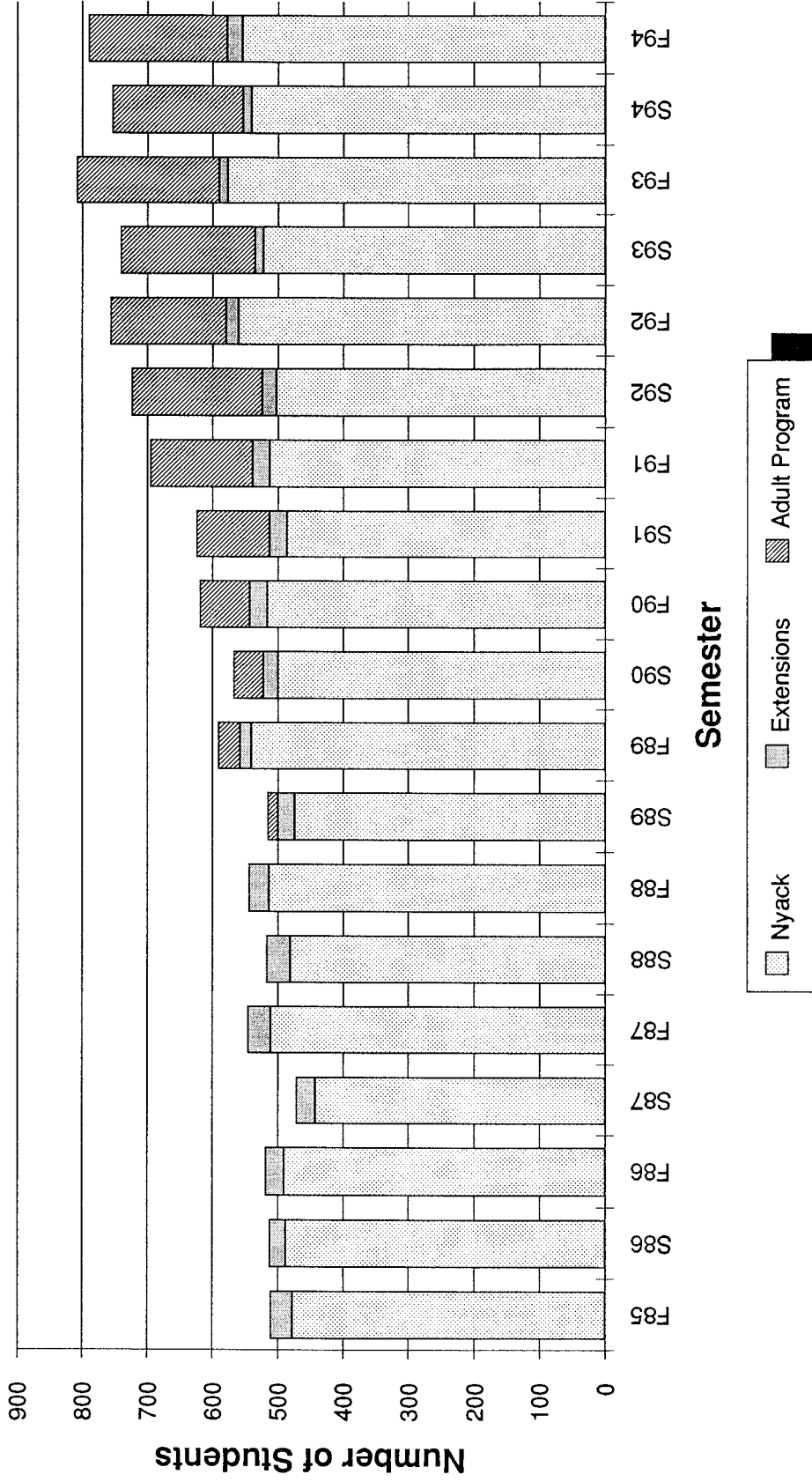

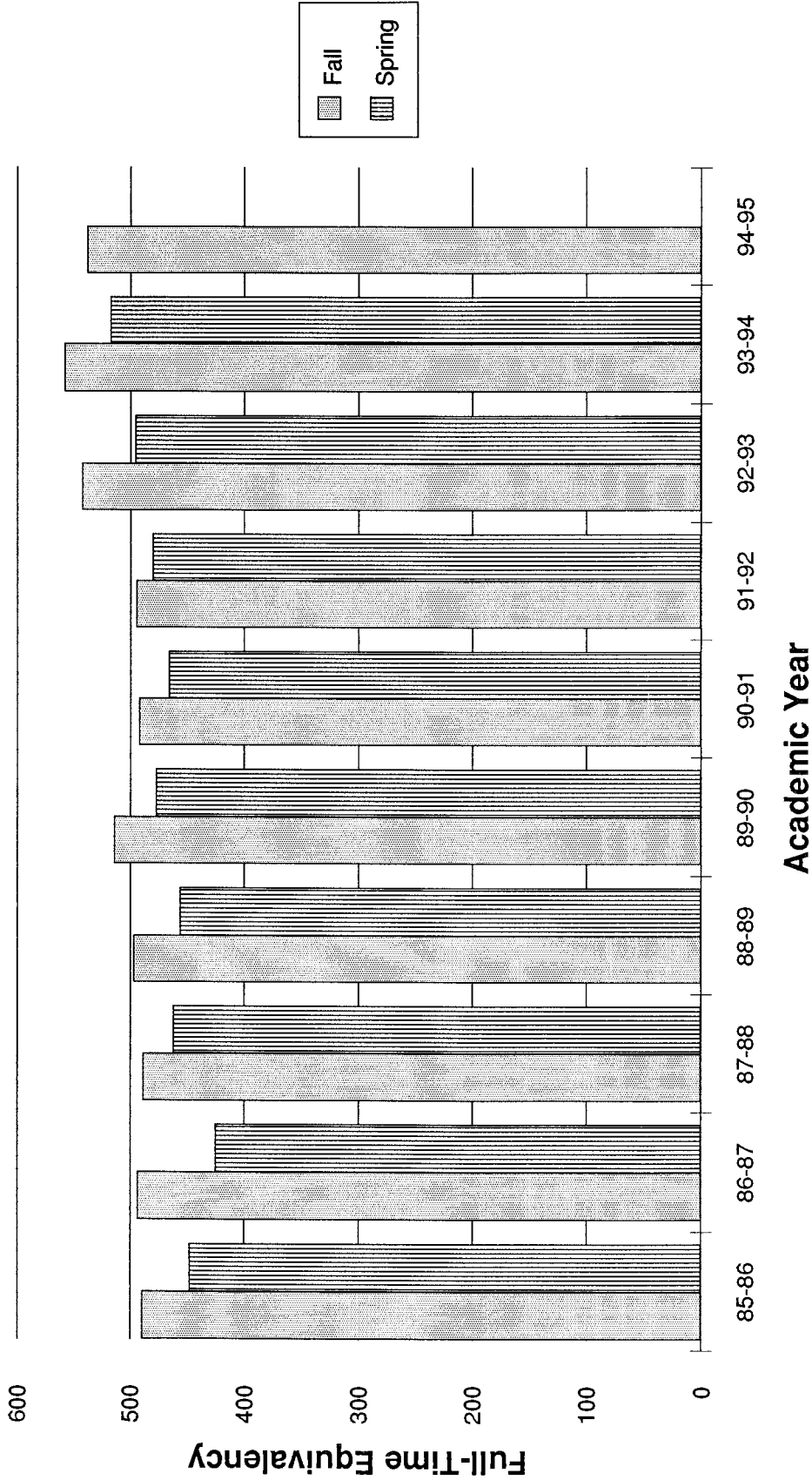
Head Count Enrollment

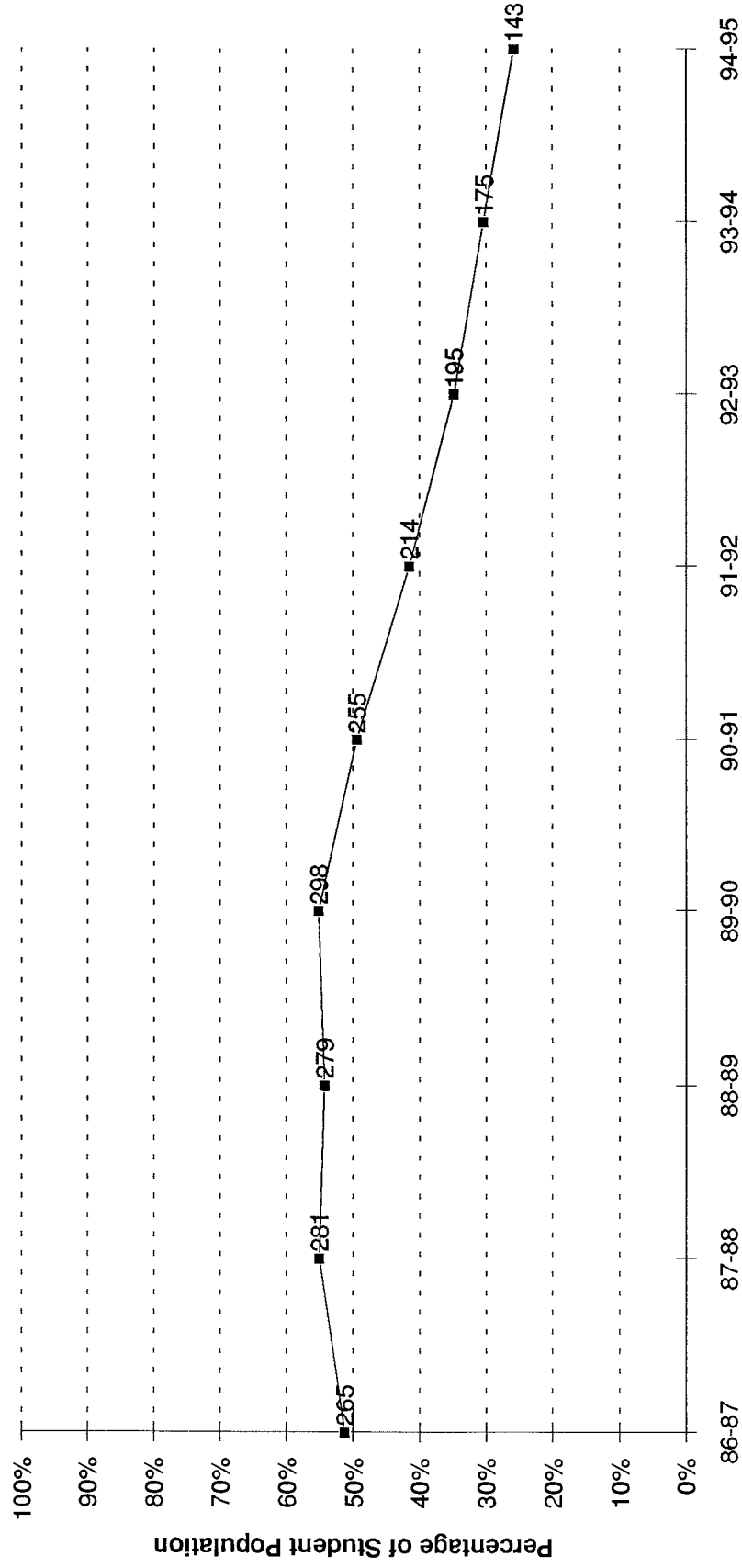

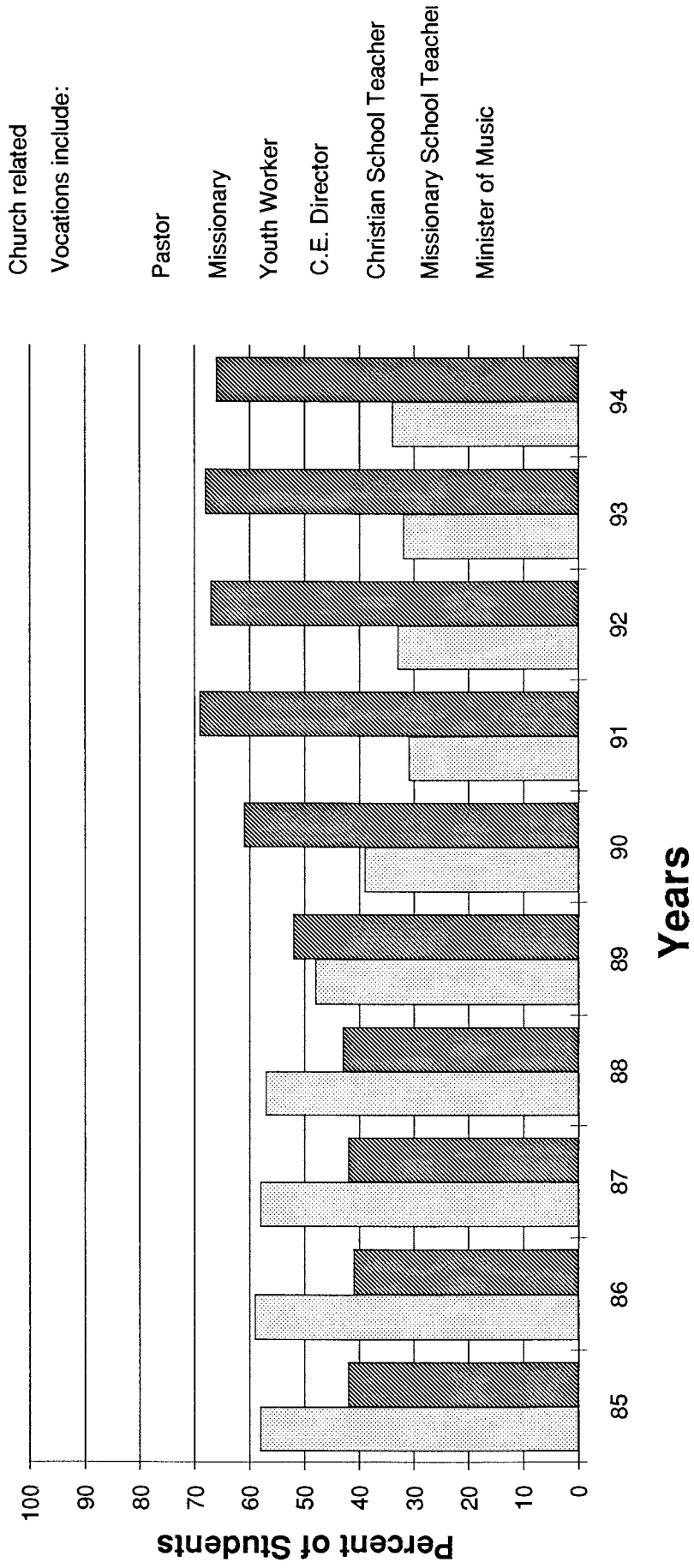
