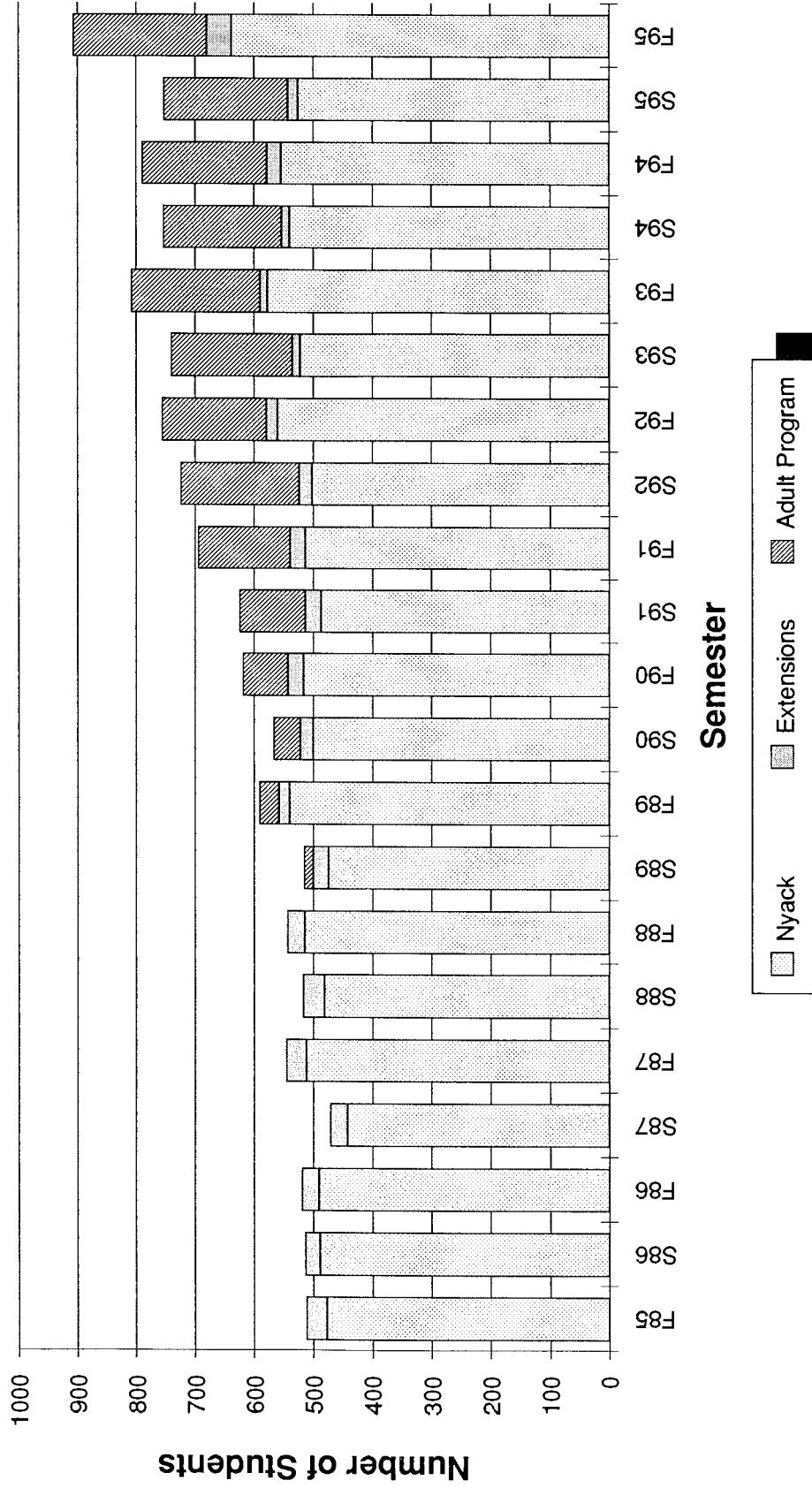

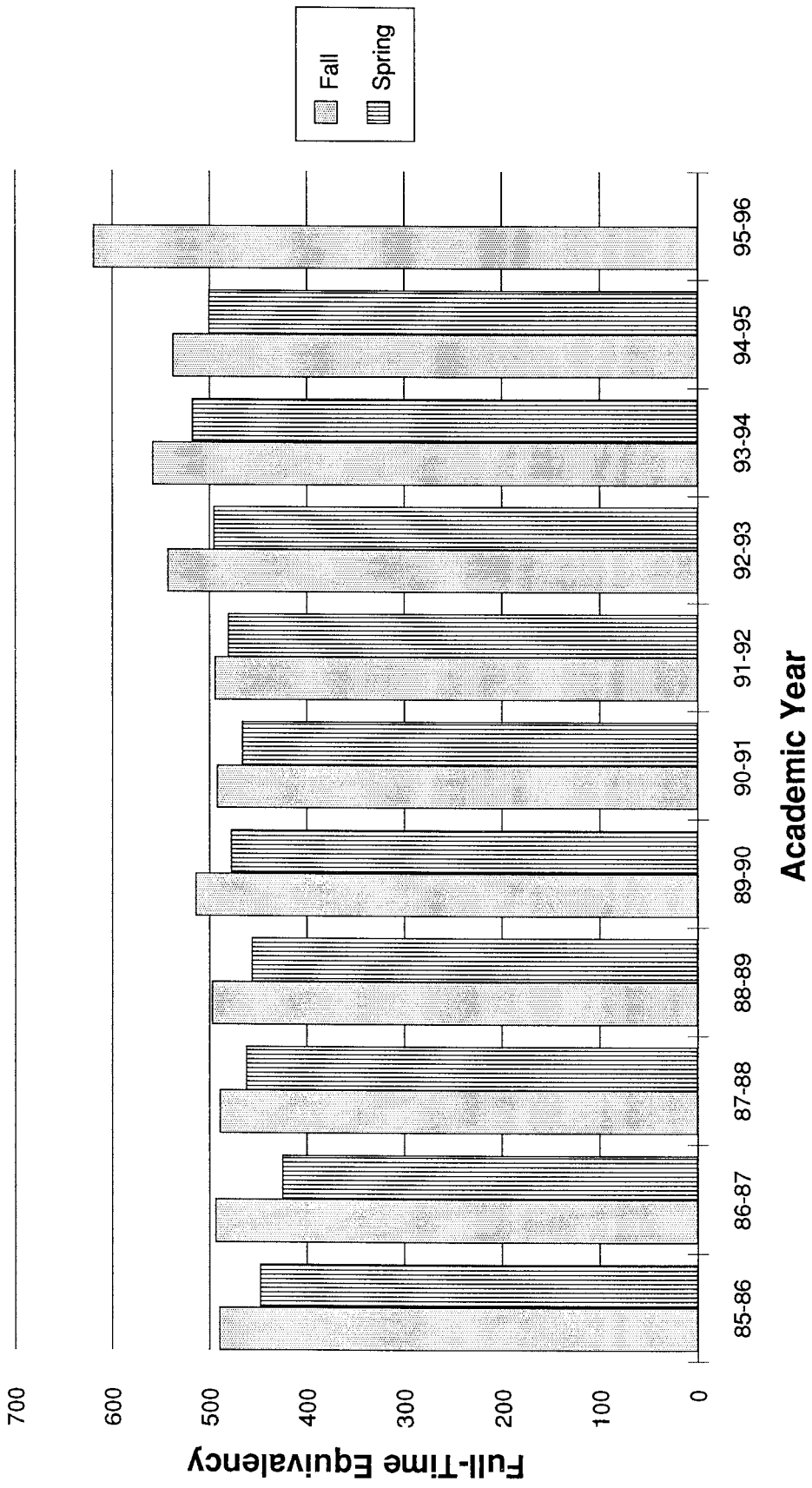
Head Count Enrollment

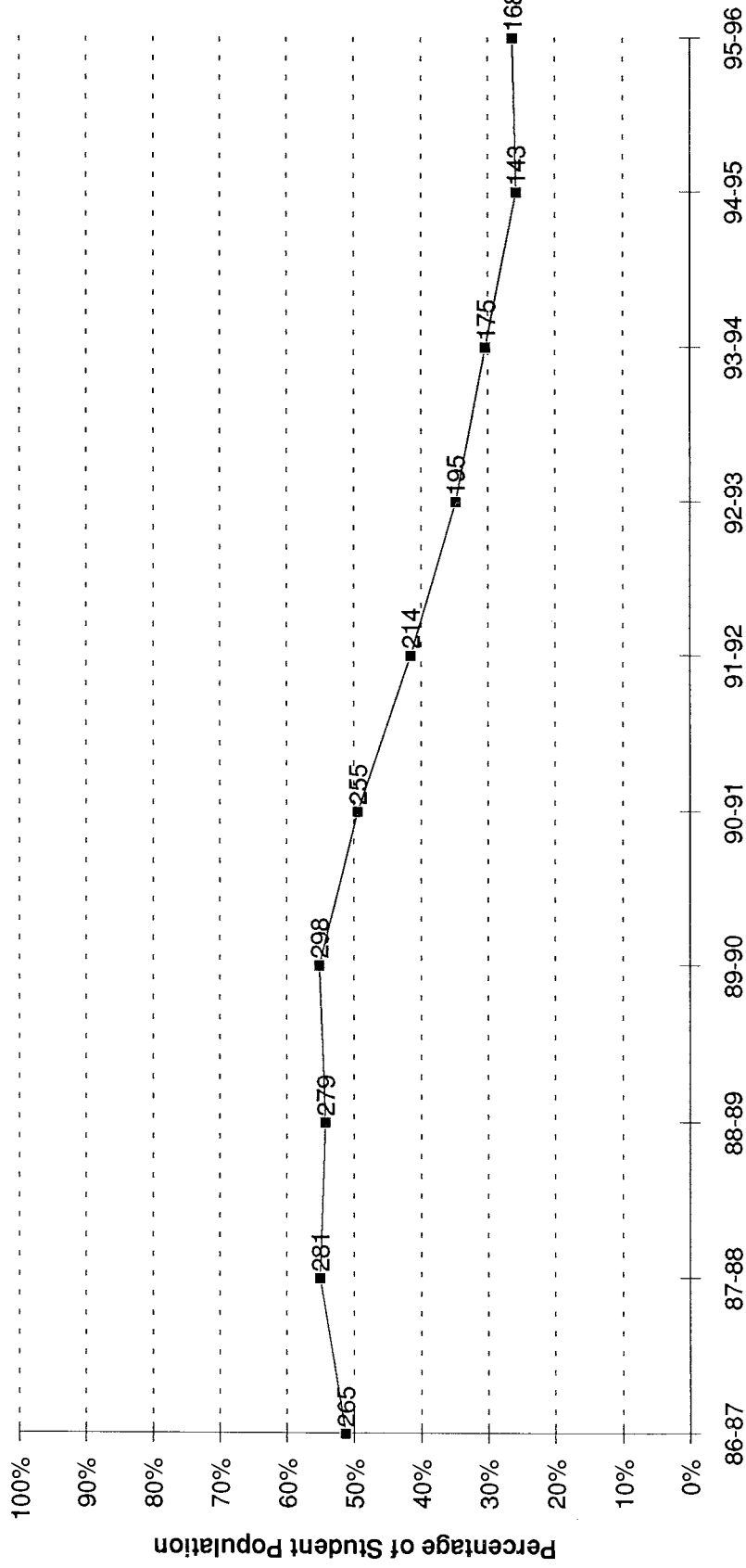

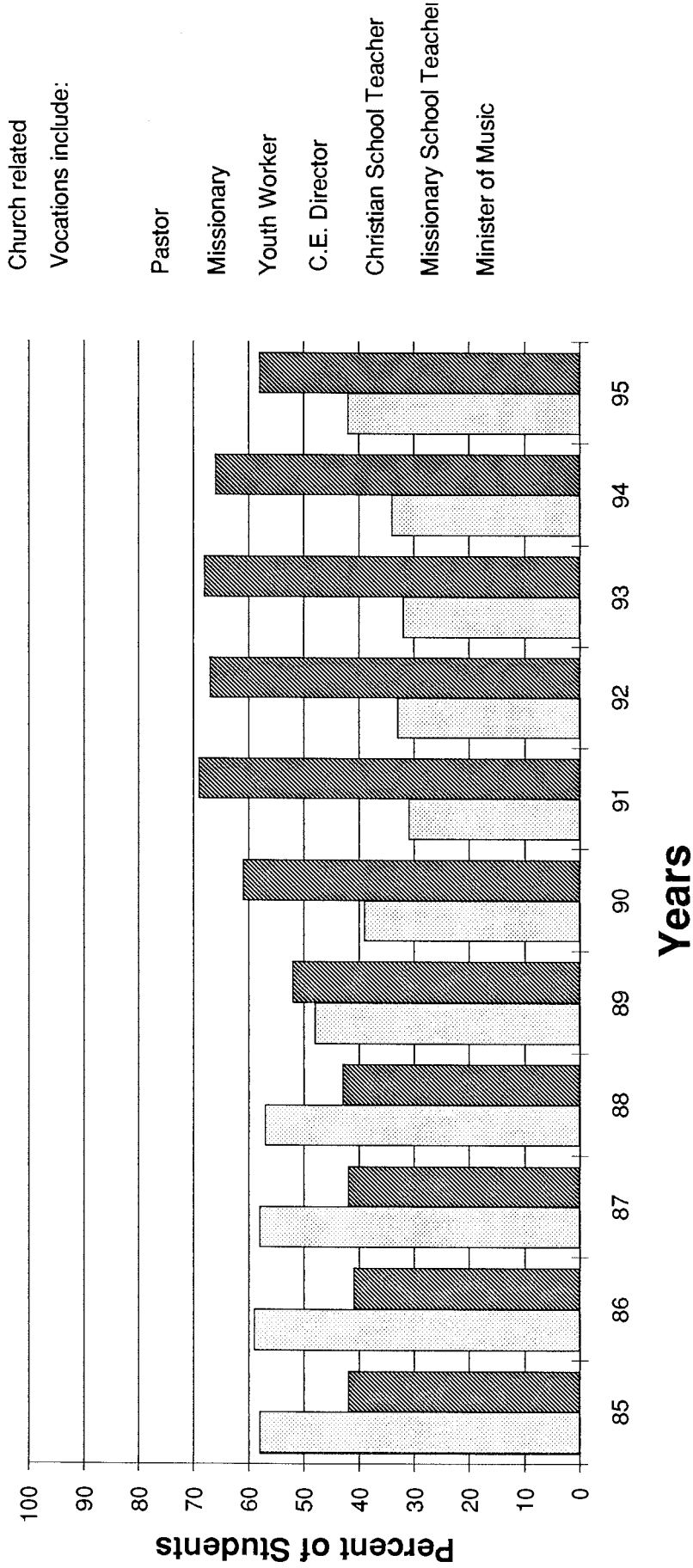
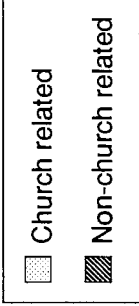
